Attendance

You must officially withdraw if you decide not to attend after registering. Non-attendance does not excuse you from academic and financial responsibility.

Financial Aid

Auditors are not eligible for any form of federal or state financial aid.

Social Security Number

Though not legally required to provide your Social Security Number, we strongly encourage you to do so. Your confidentiality will be maintained. Your Social Security Number is required if you apply for educational benefits. You will also need to supply a Social Security Number if you apply as a degree-seeking candidate and wish to receive financial aid at a later date.

Campus ID, ePanther ID and Panther-Link Email

If taking a UWM course for the first time, you will be assigned a Campus ID. After we receive your application, we will mail you a confirmation letter that will include your Campus ID number, information on how to activate your account and directions for establishing a password. Once you have successfully set your password, you will be able to access campus computing resources, including email.

Application Use:

Use this application if you are 60 or older and/or disabled to audit undergraduate courses but not earn a degree. Admission as an auditor defines that you are qualified in one of the following ways:

60 or older auditors

1. You are 60 years old by the first day of class
2. You are a bona fide resident of Wisconsin for 12 months prior to the start of the semester
3. Must provide proof of age (i.e. Driver's License)

Disabled auditors

1. Must provide proof of disability

This application is not appropriate if you are seeking:

- * Graduate courses
- * Teacher certification
- * An undergraduate certificate

EXTRACT FROM SECTION 36.27(2)(e), WISCONSIN STATUTES OF 2005
RELATING TO EXEMPTION FROM NONRESIDENT TUITION AT
THE UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN–MILWAUKEE

36.27 Tuition.

(36.27(1)(b) (b) The board shall permit a person who is 60 years of age or older to audit a course without paying an auditor's fee if the person is a resident of this state, as determined under sub. (2) (e), space is available in the course and the instructor approves.

Residency

(e) In determining bona fide residence at the time of the beginning of any semester or session and for the preceding 12 months the intent of the person to establish and maintain a permanent home in Wisconsin is determinative. In addition to representations by the student, intent may be demonstrated or disproved by factors including, but not limited to, timely filing of a Wisconsin income tax return of a type that only full-year Wisconsin residents may file, voter registration in Wisconsin, motor vehicle registration in Wisconsin, possession of a Wisconsin operator's license, place of employment, self-support, involvement in community activities in Wisconsin, physical presence in Wisconsin for at least 12 months preceding the beginning of the semester or session for which the student registers, and, if the student is not a U.S. citizen, possession of a visa that permits indefinite residence in the United States. Notwithstanding par. (a), a student who enters and remains in this state principally to obtain an education is presumed to continue to reside outside this state and such presumption continues in effect until rebutted by clear and convincing evidence of bona fide residence
