





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# **Opportunities to Improve Experience**

- How can Articulation Agreements benefit students who don't complete the associate's degree?
- Are Transfer Guides available for top feeder institutions? Are they updated annually?
- When students reach out to a school/college about transfer credit, are they given information that includes time remaining to earn UWM degree?
- What academic policies impact transfer students? Should those policies impact transfer students?



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# **Opportunities to Improve Experience**

- Make all transfer-related information easily accessible online within school/college website
  - Include information students are not asking but should be
- Simplify process to get exceptions or waivers for course requirements/equivalencies
  - Where can common exceptions or waivers be made rules



# Website Information to Include

- Application Information: OUA Transfer Admissions Link
- Details regarding selective admission (if applicable)
- Information on additional steps required to be admitted to major
- Transfer Guides & Articulation Agreements
- Prospective student contact information & unofficial credit review option
- Admitted student contact information
- Relevant Transfer Academic Policies
  - Transfer GPA vs. Major GPA
  - Course Repeat Policies
  - Credits in Residence Policies
- Financial Aid & Scholarship information: Link to Financial Aid websites
- Clear outline of general education requirements, major requirements, and any other experiences required for graduation within the program.
- Interesting information about programs that should be highlighted for students
