IV. Approval of the <u>Meeting Minutes from May 9, 2023</u>

Jen Gutzman moved to approve the minutes from the May meeting. Nicolas Russell seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

VI. New Business:

A. Elect Co-chair/Vice Chair

Michael Newman nominated himself as co-chair. Jen Gutzman seconded the nomination. The motion passed unanimously.

B. Revisions to the GER Implementation Document

1. <u>FD 2836R2</u>

2. <u>GER Implementation Document</u>

The revision to FD 2836R2 passed Faculty Senate without coming to APCC first. The document is coming to APCC now to complete the approval process. The committee is changing the GER Implementation Document to correspond with the faculty document. Kristin Sziarto pointed out that there was some language in the implementation document that is no longer relevant. The following sentence should be removed: "The placement exam tests reading comprehension and grammatical structure."

Jen Gutzman moved to approve the changes to the Implementation Document with the noted amendment. Ionel Popa seconded the motion and the motion carried.

C. <u>Undergraduate Program Review – Biology and Microbiology</u>

Leggy Arnold presented the report on the undergraduate programs in Biology and Microbiology. The review team recommended that the program be continued, that the program work with the College of Letters and Science to improve student retention, including a strategy for minority students. Further recommendations include recruiting at least two faculty over the next three years, increasing the opportunities for undergraduate students to work with research faculty, and investing in the replacement of failing old instrumentation equipment in conjunction with preventive maintenance for laboratories and student-centered spaces.

Kristen Murphy noted a typographical error: the word "carrier" on page seven should be "career."

Nicolas Russell moved to approve the report as amended. Zack Durlam seconded the motion, Jen Gutzman abstained, and the motion carried

D. <u>Undergraduate Program Review – Biomedical Sciences</u>

Aki Roberts presented the report on Biomedical Sciences. The review team recommended that the program be continued, that the program upgrade their laboratory equipment to keep up with changes in technology, that the program develop an assessment and evaluation plan, and that the program should be allowed to hire tenure-track faculty soon to continue to provide stability for the program.

Kristen Murphy recommended changing "based on an educated guess by Program faculty" to "no data available." She also pointed out that a sentence on page six is ambiguous. The sentence should read, "Of the senior faculty, at the start of the 2022 academic year, one was chair and another the Associate Dean."

Suzanne Boyd requested that recommendations be numbered.

Zack Durlam moved to approve the report as amended. Gwyn Wallander seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

E. <u>Undergraduate Program Review – Nutritional Sciences</u>

Ben Church presented the report on Nutritional Sciences. The review team recommended that the program be continued, that the program hire an additional faculty member, consider an accelerated BS-MS program, develop an alumni survey tool to track alumni success and employment, consult with the Office of Assessment and Institutional Research on specifics for tracking 5-year completion rates, and consult with advising staff to determine why students may be challenged with completing the program in five years.

Minor edits on page 2: "Zibler" should be "Zilber" and "(ZPCH)" should be "(ZCPH)."

Nicolas Russell moved to approve the report as amended. Jen Gutzman seconded the motion and the motion carried.
