Academic Policies

Final Exam Schedule

<u>SAAP 1-9</u> and the <u>Final Exam Schedule</u> provide the pre-determined time of each final and policy related to changing the final exam time.

Teaching Evaluation Procedures

<u>SAAP 1-14</u> = teaching evaluation policies.

The department/instructional unit determines the format of its course evaluations, so consult your department chairperson with questions.

FERPA

Student privacy federal regulation! See the <u>FERPA for Faculty and Staff webpage</u> to understand *requirements*, and complete the <u>on-line FERPA training</u> and quiz.

Posting of Student Grades

Posting a list of students' names and grades violates FERPA. Social security numbers or student ID numbers, whole or in part, may not be used to identify any course or assignment grades. You may post grades using procedures to ensure student anonymity, such as a unique identifier known only to the student and instructor, BUT do not order the list alphabetically.

The Incomplete Policy!

In order to earn an Incomplete, the student must have completed nearly all of a course's requirements until near the end of the term, when, because of "unusual and substantiated cause," they are unable to finish. After that point, undergraduates have until the end of the next 16-week semester to complete the work before their grade automatically converts to an F. Graduate students have a calendar year before their grade becomes a Permanent Incomplete. Since fall 2019, we have had an average of 266 incomplete grades lapse into Fs or Pls. Please use incompletes judiciously and in consultation with the student. In cases where students have not completed the vast majority of a course, they are often better served by repeating the course.



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Student Success Policies and Resources – End of Semester

Course Materials. Increase accessibility to course materials. Providing multiple ways to access class materials and reduce textbook costs leads to improved student success.

Course Reserve. Please consider putting a copy of your textbook and other course materials on Course Reserve. See the UWM Libraries Reserve Services website for more information.

Accommodations for Students with Disabilities, and Universal Design. In the pursuit of equal access and in compliance with federal and state laws, UWM and instructors are required to provide accommodations to students with documented disabilities. The Accessibility Resource Center (ARC) offers faculty and staff support and education for working with students who have disabilities by sharing important resources and links on their Faculty/Staff webpage, including specifics on how and where to submit requests for Media Captioning.

<u>Medical Services</u> and <u>Counseling Services</u> including individual and group counseling, "Let's Talk," brief informal virtual confidential consultations with counselors, and <u>Expanded Counseling Services</u> such as after hours and teletherapy.
