Department of Architecture and Urban Planning: Mark Keane

Mark Keane presented about a study abroad opportunity, available to all students, that has been successful in the Architecture Department in the past. It is a 65 day summer program in Paris and Rome. The class is open to all undergraduate and graduate students and is available for 3-9 credits. None of the time is spent in a classroom, but rather in various sites in Paris and Rome. The total cost of the program including flights, housing, fees, instruction, ground transit, lecturers and CIE administration is \$7,250. The opportunity is available to around 32 students.
