TRIO Quick Facts



- ► Funded by U.S. Department of Education
- ▶ 2,834 TRIO programs in all 50 states, Puerto Rico, Guam, and the Marshall Islands, serving about 790,000 students.
- ▶ 65 TRIO programs in Wisconsin, serving over 11,000 students
- ► More than 7,000 students with disabilities and 6,000 U.S. veterans are currently enrolled in TRIO programs.
- ▶ 37% of TRIO students are White/Caucasian, 35% are African-American, 19% are Hispanic, 4% are Native American and 4% are Asian-American.
- ▶ UWM serves nearly 2,300 TRIO students a year with over \$2 million in funding
- ► One of every five TRIO students in Wisconsin are served by UWM. Classes of 2013, 2014 & 2015: Out of 432 graduates, 347 went on to college (80%)
- ▶ Of the 347 graduates who went to college, 88 attended UWM (25%)

UWM TRIO Student Support Services

- ► First funded UWM grant 1970
- ► Competitive proposal peer reviews 5-year cycles (2015-2020 for \$1.55 million)
- Federal Criteria:
 - ▶ 2/3 first-generation (F/G) & low-income (L/I)
 - ▶ 1/3 F/G or L/I or documented disability (D/S)
 - ► Minimum 250 participants annually
- ► Typically 120 new and 130 continuing (30-60 credit hours)
- ▶ UWM admitted F/G undecided L&S and non-Bridge AOC students
- ► At least (2,366 / 4732) (50%) new freshmen were eligible for SSS (2013)

UWM TRIO Student Support Services

OBJECTIVES

- ▶ Objective 1. <u>Persistence</u> Rate: 70% of all enrolled participants served by the SSS project will persist from one academic year to the beginning of the next academic year or earned bachelor degree at the grantee institution during the academic year.
- ► Objective 2. <u>Good Academic Standing</u> Rate: 70% of all enrolled participants served by the SSS project will meet the performance level required to stay in good academic standing at the grantee institution.
- ► Objective 3. <u>Graduation</u> Rate (4-year institutions only): 20% of new participants served each year will graduate within six (6) years.

DIRECT SERVICES

- Proactive scheduled individual and group advising plus walk-in hours (1:125 advisor/student average ratio)
- ► EAB SSC outreach and monitoring advising campaigns
- **▶** Computer lab unlimited access with free printing
- Educational/cultural activity promotion
- Summer Bridge Program (optional but highly recommended)
- ► Supplemental Grant Funding for students in good standing with unmet financial need or loans
- Laptop loan program (Mac and PC)
