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I. Placement levels will be numerical not alphabetical, and will be written out in whole in the course description.

- For example: Math 98's prereq won't be "Math Placement Level D", which is currently only defined on some website, but will be:"Math Placement Level IO, which is earned by any of the following: (a) Level IO on Math Placement Test; (b) Grade of C or better in Math 090; or (c) Grade of D in Math 094."
- We hope this will add transparency to the placement/course selection process!
II. There will also be a few (some serious) course prereq changes (see remaining slides), due to UW system initiatives in cross-campus articulation of courses and placement.....

- Math I05 - prereq won't look like it's changing much: from "Math Placement Level C" to:"Math Placement Level 20, which is earned by any of the following: (a) Level 20 or 26 on Math Placement Test; (b) Grade of $C$ or better in Math 094, 095, or 098; or (c) ACT math subscore of 24 or higher."
- (a) One small change: 26 is a revived code, if they place into 105 but out of II7, we'll record that.
- (a) Hidden big change: Per UW system, the placement exam cutscore to obtain level 20 is moving up. Roughly 400 students in 105 fall ' 17 would be in 98 fall ' 18 with same scores.
Hence we're offering more combos of $98+108$ for fall, please encourage your stronger students who place in 98 to take the combo (esp. STEM intended).
- (b) Also per system, Math I05's content is changing: "bottom" I/3 of content is removed, replaced by more applications and more time on the more difficult concepts.
- As such title is changing to "Introduction to College Algebra".
- And it won't work for students to go from 102 or 103 to 105 , so note in (b) math 102 is missing (as is I03). Students need to choose carefully between $92 / 103$ and $94 / 98$, and only take $92 / 103$ if they don't need more math beyond the QLA.


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- Math II5 - since I05 is going up, we're slightly lowering the prereq of II5: students will no longer need a B in I05 to go on to II5, a C will suffice (Yay!). The prereq will just be level 30, just like II7 or 2 II.
- Math 116 - prereq coming down to level 20 to match 105 and II6 will be QLA.This placement score is the same as Madison's transfer equivalent College Algebra course.

Students at level 20 (or 26) will choose between II6 and I05! (or 103 or I75).

- Take 105 if heading to 211 or 117 (SARUP - if earned 20 not 26).
- Take II6 (then II7 if 20 not 26 ) if heading to 23 I or 213 .
- What if they take 105 then change their minds? It's ok, just take II5.

So students heading to 231 will follow (jumping in per placement) one of the following:

- Math 94 -> 116 -> 117 -> 23I; or
- Math 98+108 -> ||5 -> 231 .
- [ or 105 -> II5 -> 23 I, if they take 105 then change their minds].


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- Math 92 - NO PREREQ!!!! No more confusing looking at ACT or talking to course coordinator for transfer students!
- Will still run in paired sections with 102 primarily in spring,
- BUT will have online 92 and 102 starting summer 20I8. Enrollment in online versions during AY may be by dept consent, as face-to-face is MUCH better for these students!
- Math I03 - Prereq lowering to level IO (instead of level 20) or Math ACT I8 (started AY I7-I8).
- 103 will still be QLA, and still primarily offered in spring. The level 10 placement exam cutscore matches UW Madison's placement exam prereq for their transfer equivalent course.
- Students will have to carefully choose between 98 and 103 , both at level 10 , or between $92+102$ or 94 , both at level 0 . The only students who should take 103 or $92+102$ are those who (a) don't need chem 100 and (b) who don't need more Math courses (except I75). But students who can take 92 or 103 for their program SHOULD as it's more appropriate for them! (both more enjoyable and higher success rate).
- Math 92 \& 103 basically not being offered in the fall should help - students needing several math courses for their program need to get started right away in 94 or 98 or the $98+108$ fall combo (of which there will be several sections).
- MthStat 215 will still have QLA satisfaction as prereq so students who take 102 or 103 can take that still.
- Students with placement level 10 (or 0 and Math ACT 18) can't go on to 100 -level algebraltrig from 102 or 103 if they don't place into it. They'll have to go back and take $98+108$ or $94+105$ even after 102 or 103 if they take those instead.
- Math 175 - Prereq will be:"C or better in 102 or 103 , or Math Placement Level 20 ". Math 102 won't be listed in math placement level 20 (nor will I03). So 175 will be the only Math course students can take after 102 or 103.
