Study Abroad = High Impact Practice

- Earn credits toward major/degree
- Develop cross-cultural competency & sensitivity
- Gain a broader global outlook
- Personal growth increase independence, maturity
- Gain critical thinking skills
- Increase language proficiency
- Job experience through an internship
- Enhance résumé -- employers are looking for skills gained through study abroad

Where can students go?

- Any student can study in almost any country in the world!
- UWM sponsors summer, UWinteriM, semester, and year-long programs in over 38 countries.
- Students don't just have to study abroad they can also do an internship abroad







Program Types

Programs available to fit all students' interests & needs

- Exchange -- direct enroll at partner university; best for an independent student
- Study Abroad -- more on-site support (may have faculty program leader) & program options (i.e. excursions); may have fewer course options
- Semester & Academic Year
- Summer, Spring Break, UWinteriM (majority are faculty-led)
- Internships
- Non-UWM sponsored programs

Top 5 FAQs About Study Abroad

I. Affordability?

- Financial aid, grants & scholarships may be used to pay for study abroad
- Scholarships -- Gilman, WI Study Abroad Grant, Diversity Scholarship, etc.
- Financing Study Abroad 101 information sessions

2. Language proficiency?

- Programs in English-speaking countries & English-taught courses in non-English speaking countries
- No language requirement for short-term programs

3. Length of programs?

Semester, Academic Year, Summer, Spring Break, and UWinteriM

4. Delay in graduation?

Plan early and work with academic advisor & study abroad coordinator

5. Offer courses in specific discipline areas?


- Many programs at comprehensive partner universities abroad
- Plan ahead to find program that fit needs
- Course equivalency approval





Application Process

- Start early!
- Work with academic advisors to discuss the best time to study abroad
- Explore program options by visiting our website or stopping by our office
- Attend a Walk-In Advising and Financial Aid Advising Sessions (beginning of each semester)
- Online Application
- Deadlines*:
 - October 1: UWinteriM & Spring programs
 - March 1: Summer, Fall & AY programs
 *Some programs have earlier deadlines
