Program Areas

- Student Support
 - Students' complaints
 - Oversee student complaints against the University.
 - Tuition and fee appeals
 - Oversee tuition appeals in accordance with UWM & UW System policies.
 - Consultation to staff and students about students experiencing challenges.
 - Student Support Team supports student well-being by identifying <u>students in</u> <u>distress</u> and coordinating interventions. Concerns include suicidal ideation and mental health challenges, severe hardship, etc.

CARE Team

The Campus Assessment, Response, and Education (CARE) Team acts in a proactive manner to identify, assess, manage, reduce and educate the campus community as to the risk of potentially harmful or threatening behavior.

Student Conduct

- Academic Misconduct
 - Implementing disciplinary procedures described in UWS Chapter 14.
 This includes plagiarism & cheating, utilizing unauthorized materials, assisting others in cheating, falsifying academic documents.
- Nonacademic Misconduct
 - Implementing disciplinary procedures described in UWS Chapter 17.
 This includes underage drinking, possession of illegal substances, disruption, violence, harassment, and violation of policies in UWS 18.

• Contact DOS to...

- o Report cheating or plagiarism.
- Report concerning/threatening behavior.
- Seek help to address a student's behavior/disruption.
- Seek assistance to help a student who expresses suicidal ideation, is homeless, has overwhelming personal challenges, etc.
- o Inform us when a student passes away & work together to provide support.
- Help a student formalize a complaint about another person, unit, or the campus.

- Help a student appeal tuition if they dropped classes due to extraordinary circumstances.
- Consult or seek advice about students.

Reporting concerns

- Submit a report at: <u>www.uwm.edu/reportit</u>
- We strive to respond in 2 business days.
- We try respect the trust/rapport you've built with the student.
- o When possible, we will first consult with the reporter and gather information.
- We seek to address concerns at the lowest level that is appropriate.
- Possible outcomes
 - Offer you strategies and advice regarding what additional steps to take.
 - Help you outline appropriate behavior, and assist with documentation and follow up.
 - Intervene and reach out to the student.
 - Refer to Student Support Team.
 - Address concern via Student Code of Conduct.
 - Refer to the CARE team.

Life Impact Program Update: Natalie Reinbold

- Open to all UWM students who have children
 - o Want to serve and support the entire UWM student-parent population
- Life Impact is grant funded
 - Constantly make adjustments to students served and scholarships provided
 - Provided support services through coaching
 - Required to do 2 student-parent workshops per year
 - Students need support more than the scholarship
- Trivia
 - The national student-parent population is...increasing
 - 30% increase in the last 8 years
 - Student-parents make up what percent of the national student population?
 - What building is the Life Imapct program housed in? Mellencamp
 - What's the national student-parent degree attainment percentage? 32%
 - The number one barrier of UWM students with children is finding childcare. True or false?
 - One of the lowest concerns because childcare relationships are often set already
 - Top priorities are housing, basic needs, personal needs

Enhancing Advising Update: Alejandra Lopez & Rebecca Reece

- Enhancing Advising represents advising from all units across campus
 - Chair positions are usually 2-year positions
 - Reps are usually 2-year positions
 - Meet with other co-chairs (ACN, ASALC, Pathway Advising)
- Meetings
 - Reps should be sharing notes from the meetings
- Advising survey that went out in late-spring/early-summer
 - Get an idea of what the concerns are for advisors
 - Results
 - Positives
 - Advisors feel satisfied with the autonomy in their positions
 - Feel satisfied in their positions
 - Concerns
 - Lack of professional development and support for professional development
 - Personal career development not being supported
 - Post-results
 - Reached out to Provost to find out about funding opportunities
 - No initial funding, but hopefully in future years
- Retreat recap
 - Design thinking exercise
 - Developed themes to focus on
 - Advocacy for advising
 - Continuing education opportunities
 - Have a seat at the table when advising needs to be represented
 - Consistency, collaboration and communication

Navigate Update: Jeremy Page & Brennan O'Lena

- Navigate Updates
 - UWM and EAB leadership changes
 - Gesele left, Angie is stepping away
 - New rep for EAB
 - Rollout at Waukesha and Washington County campuses
 - All advisors across UWM are now using Navigate
 - Updated Navigate website: www.uwm.edu/navigate
 - Hope to fill it with resources for faculty, staff and advisors
 - Informational resources only. Students should still access through the UWM homepage
 - Weekly office hours on Wednesday at noon, or by appointment
 - Information is on the Navigate website
 - Created a video tutorial demonstrating the three ways instructors can utilize Progress
 Reports
 - Through the campaign, through ad hoc reports and through alerts
 - o Revised content students receive from instructors, with action language
 - Tailored by reason
 - Progress report is live on all campuses
 - Goes until November 2
 - All UW System campuses are using Navigate in some form now
- Navigate goals for academic year
 - Conduct environmental scan involving conversations with all schools and colleges and support offices included in the Coordinated Care Network.
 - o Increase **progress report** usage and develop reporting metrics for stakeholders.
 - Support academic advising unit usage of Navigate through requiring two campaigns per school/college per year, and developing common naming, reporting, and tracking conventions.

- Develop faculty advising functions and capacities, including appointment scheduling and note-taking.
- Enhance training infrastructure using Navigate website to support user on-boarding and off-boarding.
 - Student-friendly tutorials
- Questions
 - O Will common practices for note taking be developed?
 - o Will faculty advisors be able to view academic advisor notes?
 - Yes, they are listed as an advisor in PAWS
 - Will be pursued further going forward
 - o Timeline for environmental scan for support units?
 - As time allows after November
 - o Graduate students in Navigate?
 - Has been explored several times but UW System and UWM have passed on it
 - Where are we at statistically as a campus for retention and how Navigate has tied in?
 - Hope to use the training to better let Navigate tell the story
 - Develop commonly understood reports at the campus level to help understand the data
 - What is the best example of outreach for faculty for progress reports? And how are advisors using them?

Graduate School: Whitney Smith

- Recruitment initiatives
 - Graduate School Open House
 - October 30 from 5-7 pm
 - Wisconsin Room of Union
 - Typically about 600 people come
 - All schools/colleges are represented
 - Invite freshman, sophomores and juniors who are just starting to think about grad school
 - Dress code is loose, no resume needed
 - If they are ready to apply they will get an application fee waiver (if the application is started after the Open House)
 - Focus groups
 - Asked undergrads questions about grad school
 - UWM graduate students are currently 25-35% UWM undergraduate students
 - Many students don't even know graduate school exists
 - Or they find the idea of graduate school very daunting
 - Will be doing more outreach to undergraduate students
 - What is Graduate School? Sessions
 - Include help on application instructions
 - Funding options
 - Different programs available
