Executive Order 13607:



Principles of Excellence for Educational Institutions Serving Service Members, Veterans, Spouses and Other Family Members

3/29/2018

Dear Colleagues:

In 2012, UWM signed an agreement to comply with the <u>Executive Order 13607</u>: "Establishing Principles of Excellence for Educational Institutions Serving Service Members, Veterans, Spouses and Other Family Members." The Executive Order from former President Obama establishes additional steps for institutions to best serve this population. The majority of the Principles of Excellence Agreement is administrative and operational, but there is an important part that requires faculty compliance. An institution must take additional steps to accommodate short absences (for less than 30 days) due to service obligations, provided that satisfactory academic progress is being made by the service members and reservists prior to suspending their studies.


Below is a list of typical short absences due to service obligations. Please note that the list is not all-inclusive.

- 1.Extra-long weekend drill commitments, which are normally Saturday /Sundays but can include other days as well.
- 2. Mandatory attendance at Service Schools for a student's military job (assuming absence for attendance does not impact overall semester work or grade).
- 3. Attendance for initial military training (boot camp) normally only if absence overlaps the start of a term or end of a semester.



What is VSOC?

The VSOC program provides a VA Veteran Readiness & Employment Counselor (VREC) to each VSOC school. These VRECs are called VetSuccess on Campus (VSOC) Counselors. A VA Vet Center Outreach Coordinator is also provided, and co-located on many campuses, to provide peer-to-peer counseling and referral services. **UWM is the only university in the state with this program.**

What types of services are available?

- Guidance and support with your VA education benefits Chapter 31
- Exploring options when you face academic difficulties
- Career exploration and assistance
- Coordinating with school faculty/staff to provide Veteran Readiness & Employment specific services referrals for readjustment counseling for eligible Veterans and their families
- Federal Resume, Job Seeking, & Interview Preparation assistance
- Information and referral for other VA benefits (i.e. Disability Compensation,
 Life Insurance, Home Loan Guaranty, and Vocational Rehabilitation)

Things to Know

- Joint Service Transcript
 - 1. Transfer Credits for Military Service.
 - 2. Satisfactory Academic Progress
- VR&E Degree audit/academic worksheet
 - 1. Start/Stop Date of the Program
 - 2. Cost of the Program
 - 3. Academic Plan/ Approval
- Best to advise Veterans or dependents using VA education benefits to seek assistance from the SCO, MAVRC, VA education dept, VSOC, or VR&E Case manager prior to dropping classes. Due to possible financial hardship.
- VA payment for classes that are in-person or online.
