



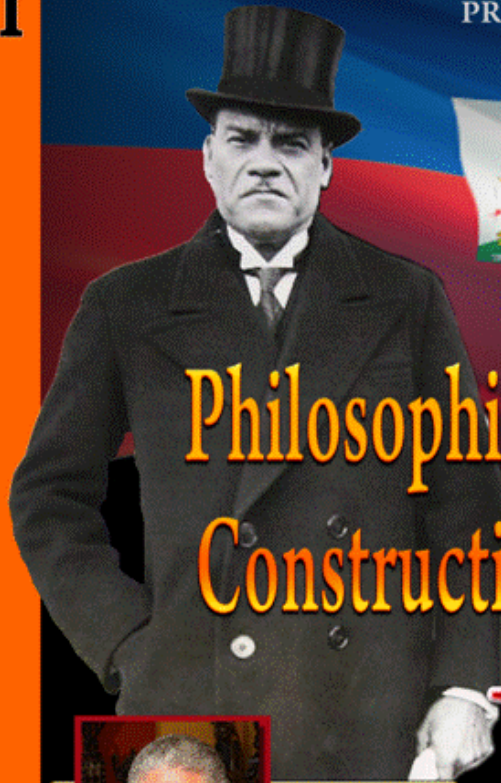

Professor Emeritus Bellegarde-Smith works in the areas of African and Neo-African religions and African diasporic social thought and philosophy.
