### SYNOPSIS

This course provides an introduction to American Indian cultures of Wisconsin. Topics dealt with during the course include: the late prehistory, the history, the social organization and contemporary condition of Wisconsin's American Indians. Groups highlighted include the Chippewa (Ojibwe), Menominee, Winnebago (Ho Chunk), Potawatomi, Oneida and Stockbridge Munsee.
