In such cases, you must contact Dr. Quinn as soon as the situation arises, to make arrangements for a makeup exam. You should make every effort to attend the original exam, as the format of makeup exams may be different than the original exam. You must provide documentation for your case. Exams cannot be rescheduled for personal travel or vacations. Please verify that you will be able to attend each of the two exams (barring unforeseen circumstances) prior to committing to this course.

Attendance in labs is mandatory. Attendance will be taken each week in lab. If you have a valid reason for missing lab, you must contact your TA in advance to make arrangements for

attending another section. Acceptable excuses include death in the family, serious medical conditions or required COVID quarantine. You will need to provide documentation for your excuse to your TA. <u>Unexcused absences cannot be made up and will result in loss of 5% of your final grade</u>. Participation points will be deducted for arriving late or departing early.
