

## Weekly Eyewash Flushing

Eyewash stations must be flushed weekly by laboratory personnel to ensure station is working properly and that the water is clean. Flushing stagnant water for a full three minutes greatly reduces the presence of acanthamoeba, reducing the risk of serious eye infections following the use of emergency eyewash stations.

## The following steps should be followed during each weekly eyewash flushing:

- Verify access to the eyewash station is unobstructed. This includes easily moved items such as chairs and carts, as these could become a hazard during an emergency situation in which eyesight may be limited.
- Place water bucket under eyewash station. Plastic sleeves may be placed over eyepieces during flushing to reduce splashing and spillage to floor.
- Ensure eyewash station activates easily with one hand, and that water flows consistently from each eyepiece.
- Allow eyewash station to flush for three full minutes. Water should be clear and free of any debris.
- Make sure floor is wiped dry in order to avoid slippage of staff and students. A wet Floor sign may be obtained from housekeeping if needed.



- Any malfunctions must be reported immediately to Facility Services (229-4742).
- Emergency Eyewash and Shower stations are checked annually by Facility Services. Contact Facility Services (229-4742) if test record is not up to date.
