ACADEMICS

- 13 degree-granting schools and colleges, along with the Graduate School and School of Continuing Education
 - Wisconsin's only architecture school
 - Wisconsin's only accredited school of public health
 - The only North American school dedicated solely to freshwater sciences
 - Largest nursing program in Wisconsin
 - Film program ranked No. 24 in the nation by The Hollywood Reporter
- 195 academic programs
 - 1 associate program
 - 93 bachelor's programs
 - 65 master's programs
 - 36 doctoral programs
- Largest and top-rated online education program in Wisconsin
 - More than 850 online courses
 - 30 fully online degree and certificate programs
 - Named best in Wisconsin by thebestschools.org

RESEARCH

- Ranked in the top 3 percent of research universities, a category known as R1, by the Carnegie Classification of Institutions of Higher Education
- \$55 million in research expenditures in 2017-18
- 2018 Campus-Wide Award for Undergraduate Research Accomplishment from the national Council on Undergraduate Research
 - 1,000 undergraduate researchers

- Total enrollment: 27,466
 - Milwaukee campus: 24,955
 - » 20,278 undergraduates
 - » 4,677 graduate students
 - UWM at Washington County: 637 students
 - UWM at Waukesha: 1,473 students
- Milwaukee campus:
 - Students from all 50 states and all 72 Wisconsin counties
 - 1,374 international students from 92 countries
 - Over 1,000 veterans enrolled, more than any other Wisconsin university
 - 37% of undergraduates are first-generation college students
 - 30% are students of color

CAMPUSES

- Milwaukee
 - 104-acre main campus and auxiliary locations
 - 54 buildings covering nearly 9 million square feet
 - Waukesha
 - 86-acre campus and auxiliary locations
 - 11 buildings covering about 280,000 square feet
 - Washington County
 - 87-acre campus in West Bend
 - 4 buildings covering nearly 200,000 square feet
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ALUMNI

- 185,000 alumni
 - 80 percent live and work in Wisconsin
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BUDGET & TUITION

- \$689 million operating budget
 - Includes \$167 million in aid passed directly to students
 - State appropriations make up about 19 percent of the remainder
 - Single largest source of income is student tuition (30 percent)
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ECONOMIC IMPACT

- \$1.5 billion economic impact on Wisconsin, according to NorthStar Consulting Group
 - 3,500 employees, plus 4,700 student workers
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DEVELOPMENT

- More than \$220 million raised since 2012
 - Over 20,000 donors
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COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

- Partnerships with 3,900 businesses, nonprofits and other organizations
 - 60,000 hours volunteered by students each year
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ENTREPRENEURSHIP

- 24,000-square-foot Lubar Entrepreneurship Center (and UWM Welcome Center) opening in spring 2019
 - 95 I-Corps teams trained since 2015
 - Over 2,000 students participate in entrepreneurship workshops annually
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ATHLETICS

- 15 Division I teams include 306 Panther athletes
 - 140 conference championships
 - 60 NCAA Tournament appearances
 - 36 consecutive semesters at a 3.0 or above GPA
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
