According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, employment opportunities for Real Estate Managers are projected to grow 5% from 2022 to 2032, faster than the average for all occupations.

The Real Estate Certificate, rooted in the core principles of real estate management, will expose students to the fundamentals of financial management, marketing, leasing, managing physical assets, and legal and risk management strategies. Students can use these foundational skills to further develop expertise in any area of focus in the real estate industry.
