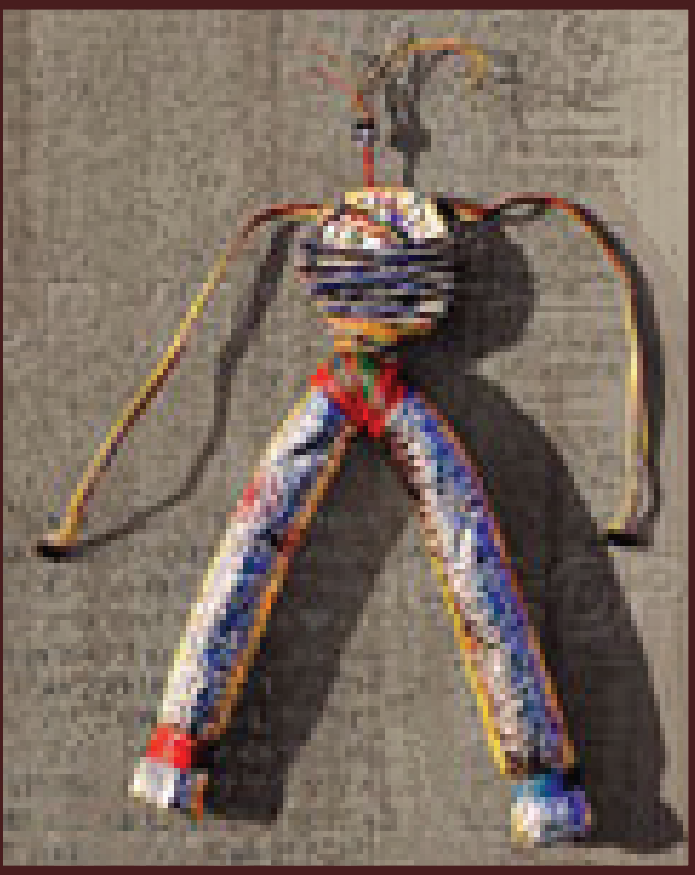

The conference will examine the uses and valences of the term "gender" a generation after its first appearance in scholarly discourse. Scholars from a number of fields will discuss the ways gender has "translated" into their own disciplinary perspectives. Participants will address such questions as: how has the study of gender, either independently or in conjunction with other axes of difference such as race, class, and sexuality, inflected existing fields of study and created new ones? To what extent has "gender" modified or reinforced related paradigms such as womens' and queer studies, or conversely been modified by them? With what discursive politics does the term engage, and with what effects? In what settings, and through what kinds of operations and transformations, can gender remain a "useful category" in the twenty-first century?

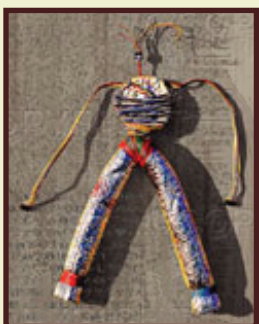
