### 5. James People overview group's charge from Chancellor

A. Goal: The 2030 Implementation Team is charged to continue the momentum of and expand upon the recommendations of the 2030+ Think Tank by creating proposed action plans that includes details on:

- Quickly executing ideas when possible.
- o Conducting analyses for areas that require more study and consultation, and
- o Creating implementation plans for all recommendations.
- B. Scope: Conduct top tier research.
  - a. Expand collaborative and interdisciplinary scholarship and graduate programs.
  - b. Infuse entrepreneurship, design thinking, and data science into faculty research and graduate and undergraduate education.
