 - b. Ideas about the structure of group's report, e.g.
 - i. Narrative section that details recommendations, rationale and anticipated outcomes
 - ii. Tablular summary of implementation actions
 - 1. Arrange actions by theme
 - For each action, articulate a sequence of steps, the estimated timing, who will lead the effort, and the other groups or individuals who will need to be involved
 - iii. Will need to include ideas regarding
 - 1. Resources
 - 2. Critical decision points (for example, approval steps) and options
 - c. Critical Issues for UWM's Research (continuation of last time)
 - i. Allocation of research time is relatively unstructured and lacks clear guidelines
 - 1. Essentially under control of Executive Committee through assignment of teaching and service duties.

- ii. IDEA: Options for addressing how research time is allocated
 - 1. Center with course releases or buyouts; potential issue of center director control of joint appointments ("fiefdoms")
 - 2. Dept-like body that allocates research time; could be set up with essentially joint appointments; less control by one individual
 - 3. Annual competition (DIG, ARC) for collection of course releases not controlled by a dean
 - 4. Criteria for automatic release of time based on specific goals and outcomes; triggers will vary by discipline; incentives
 - 5. Question for all of these: To what extent do they need to be funded?
 - a. Potential need is to support alternative instruction.
 - b. Can this be managed at a department?
- iii. IDEA: Another approach
 - 1. Ask researchers: What do you need to improve your research program/increase your research productivity?
 - 2. Evaluate these needs; need to consider review process; potentially use external review
- iv. Underlying Issue: resistance to differential work assignments
 - 1. EC and/or dean
 - 2. P&P sentence gives the EC the right to determine workload
 - a. **IDEA**: should this be changed?
- v. **IDEA**: set up a "matrix" approach
 - 1. Cross-cut formal structure to identify researchers with similar research interests.
 - 2. Post-tenure, faculty may be more able to "float" into these more
 - 3. Link up to some small grant support for groupings; help free up time
- vi. Faculty Development Recruiting and Retaining Great Faculty
 - 1. Ask people what makes people stay at UWM
 - a. What do they need?
 - b. Consider variations between senior and junior faculty
 - 2. Interview departing faculty
 - 3. **IDEA**: survey departing and retained faculty to get information on these two groups and their needs
