Latin Americanist faculty from all disciplines are invited to participate in the spring 2016 Teaching and Learning Workshop. The workshop is offered in collaboration with the Consortium of Latin American Studies Programs (CLASP), a national organization supporting teaching, outreach and program development.

The topic of this year's T & L workshop is the development of study abroad courses in Latin America. The focus will be on 3-4 week-long courses related to the Humanities and Social Sciences, but we will also have time to discuss other options. We will provide some basic ideas on the resources needed to develop a course, discuss how to help students connect their experience with intellectually challenging material, as well as hear from students who participated in study abroad courses in Latin America about their experiences.

The workshop is intended to build on the cross-disciplinary nature of the NCCLA, bringing together regional scholars to talk about a particular topic or pedagogical tool in an informal, roundtable format. This is NOT a conference where presenters are expected to share a paper. Instead, as noted above, we will talk as a group about these issue areas.
