HOW TO MAJOR OR MINOR IN ECONOMICS

The major in Economics leads to the B.A. in the college of Letters and Science. It provides the centerpiece for rigorous study of liberal arts and is a strong complement to the study of Business, Engineering or Education. For many students, subjects such as History, Sociology, Political Science, International Studies, and Pre-Law are better learned in combination with Economics. Course descriptions are available on the departmental website.

Please meet with a departmental advisor to formally declare the Major or Minor. Students should also consult with their Letters and Science advisor to ensure satisfaction of L&S requirements and to obtain a degree audit.

MAJOR IN ECONOMICS

COURSE OF STUDY: Major

The major in economics requires a minimum of 30 credits including the following:

Econ 103	Principles of Microeconomics	3 credits
Econ 104	Principles of Macroeconomics	3 credits
Econ 210*	Economic Statistics	3 credits
Econ 301	Intermediate Microeconomics	3 credits
Econ 302	Intermediate Macroeconomics	3 credits

* Bus Adm 210 (Introduction to Management Statistics) or MthStat 215 (Elementary Statistical Analysis) may be substituted for Econ 210 and will count in the Major GPA.

At least 15 credits must be in upper-division (300-level and above) economics courses taken in residence at UWM. At least one course must be at the 400 level or above (excluding Econ 415 or Econ 450). To major in economics, students must earn a grade of at least C in Econ 103 and 104, attain at least a 2.0 GPA in all credits in the major attempted at UWM, and attain at least a 2.0 GPA on all major credits attempted when transfer work is included along with the UWM work.

Research Requirement

All majors in economics must complete a research experience by selecting a 400- or 500-level course (except Econ 415 or 450) in which they will write and present a research paper. Eligible courses include Econ 404, 411, 413, 426, 432, 447, 448, 454, 455, 506, 513, 525, or 699. The contents of the paper and the presentation of the results are arranged by the student with the faculty member teaching the course at the beginning of the semester. Once the paper is complete

and has been presented in class, the student submits to the faculty member a Research Requirement Completion form (attached to the end of this document) to indicate that this degree requirement has been satisfied. This form will be signed by the faculty member and submitted to the Chair of the Economics Department.

Honors in the Major

Departmental honors are awarded upon graduation to students who achieve a 3.00 GPA on all credits attempted, a 3.50 GPA on all credits that count toward the major, and a 3.50 GPA on all credits in advanced-level (numbered 300 and above) courses that count toward the major.

Optional Concentrations

The Department offers three optional concentrations within the major. While completing the major requirements outlined above, students may elect to complete one of the following sets of requirements.

- International Economics - three courses from the international module:
 - Econ 351, 353, 454, 455.
- Quantitative Methods - three courses from the quantitative methods module:
 - Econ 310, 411, 413, 513.
- Graduate Preparation - two courses each from the quantitative methods module and the economics theory module:
 - Econ 413, 506, 513, 606

MINOR IN ECONOMICS

COURSE OF STUDY: Minor

The Minor in Economics requires a minimum of 18 credits, including:

Econ 103	Principles of Microeconomics	3 credits
Econ 104	Principles of Macroeconomics	3 credits
Econ 210*	Economic Statistics	3 credits

* Bus Adm 210 (Introduction to Management Statistics) or MthStat 215 (Elementary Statistical Analysis) may be substituted for Econ 210 and will count in the Minor GPA.

The remaining 9 credits must be in upper-division (300-level and above) Economics courses; 9 credits in upper-division courses must be taken in residence at UWM. Students must attain at least a 2.0 GPA in all credits in the minor attempted at UWM and attain at least a 2.0 GPA on all minor credits attempted when transfer work is included along with the UWM work.
