
# PRODUCTION: THE FURROW CLASS



## A NOTE FOR ART AND DESIGN STUDENTS

The Art & Design majors who sign up through Art 427 tend to serve as Art Editors, Graphic Designers, Staff Photographers, and Layout Designers. Their tasks may involve logo design, rebranding, selection of art submissions, cover design, preparation of promotional images, and layout design of the print issue, website, and promotional materials.
