## **Course Description:**

This course provides an introductory survey of Shakespearean drama through a focused study of Shakespeare's Sonnets and five plays: <u>The Merchant of Venice</u>, <u>Henry V</u>, <u>Hamlet</u>, <u>Othello</u>, and <u>The Tempest</u>. Complementing our close reading of the plays, we will also be situating the texts in relation to their literary, theatrical, and historical contexts. Because Shakespeare wrote his plays for performance rather than publication, we will pay particular attention to the cultural importance of the early modern theater. In addition, we will examine the ways these texts have been reinterpreted over time by looking at the plays in performance and on film.

## **Course Requirements:**

Course work will consist of reading questions on each play (5 in all) as well as 8 posts (500 words each) to the online discussion forum.
