**English 207: Health Science Writing** 

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This course is particularly appropriate for students in the College of Health Sciences, the College of Nursing, Pre-Medicine, Dental, other medical fields, and the Professional Writing Program. As this course is intended for students from a variety of disciplines, it focuses on writing professionally and effectively within medical fields, rather than on writing tasks or formats particular to any one medical specialty.

Course Description: The primary learning objectives of this course are to: address various writing purposes; adapt writing to both technical and non-technical audiences; organize documents based on types of messages and audiences; use medical and scientific databases to conduct research related to current healthcare issues; analyze and evaluate types of sources; incorporate healthcare-related research into documents; use various strategies to define and explain technical terms and concepts; convey written report data in a presentation format; use visual representations of data in documents; and, produce precise and concise documents in correct formats. Assignments will focus on communication appropriate for healthcare professionals, as well as for patients/clients and other laypeople.
