- State appropriations make up about 22%
- Single largest source of income is student tuition (30%)

#### **ECONOMIC IMPACT**

- \$1.5 billion economic impact on Wisconsin, according to NorthStar Consulting Group
- 6,700 employees, including 3,800 student workers, as of Oct. 31, 2021

#### **DEVELOPMENT**

- Our most recent universitywide fundraising effort, Made in Milwaukee, Shaping the World: The Campaign for UWM, raised \$251 million from 2012 to 2019
- In 2021, UWM had its first-ever, universitywide day of giving on April 14 (414 Day) and raised more than \$347,000 from 1,232 donors

#### **COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT**

- Partnerships with more than 4,000 businesses, nonprofits and other organizations
