- Submit a UW-System Application [online](#) or [mail](#) to the Office of Undergraduate Admissions, P.O. Box 413, Milwaukee, WI 53201
 - Priority Application Deadline for Fall: **March 1st**
 - Priority Application Deadline for Spring: **October 1st**
- Submit all appropriate transcripts to the Office of Undergraduate Admissions, P.O. Box 749, Milwaukee, WI 53201
 - Include Official High School transcripts and/or GED/HSED score report
 - Include all post-secondary transcripts

Articulation Agreement: Program to Program Transfer Conditions from Police Science at MATC to Criminal Justice at UWM

Students who have received or will receive an Associate of Applied Science degree in Police Science from MATC after December 31, 1986 are eligible to transfer into the Criminal Justice Program at UWM. Work with an MATC Transfer Specialist to review the following:

- The student must meet General Education Requirements
- Course equivalencies below are only accepted for transfer students in the Criminal Justice program
- Course equivalencies above are subject to change in the event that the curricula of MATC or UWM undergoes revision
- The maximum credit transfer is 72 credits (including College Parallel Courses) with the following maximum credit transfers: 30 General Education; 15 Criminal Justice Major and 12 non-major Criminal Justice Electives

The Criminal Justice Major requires a total of 27 Social Science Electives in the areas of Anthropology, Economics, History, Political Science, Psychology and Sociology. The courses must be designated "SS" as General Education Requirements at UWM. Of the 27 credits, 15 must be from a single concentration and 12 credits must be from a combination of two or more subjects outside of the 15 credit concentration. MATC offers qualifying courses in Economics, History, Psychology and Sociology. Ask your Academic Advisor or an MATC Transfer Specialist for assistance planning your schedule.

In addition to the Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice, Certificate Programs in Forensic Science, Death Investigation or Forensic Toxicology are available. Students must be enrolled at UWM and have achieved credit in the UWM equivalent of CHEM 100 or 101 (Chemical Science) and BIO SCI 100 (Survey of Zoology) or 101 (Survey of Microbiology) or 102 (Elements of Biology).

- You may take NATSCI 207 at MATC to satisfy the requirement of CHEM 100 or 101
- You may take NATCHI 114, 197, or 236 at MATC to satisfy the requirement of BIO SCI 100, 101, or 102
