Admission Guidelines

Transfer admission is a holistic and selective process, and no single criterion guarantees admission. The following factors are taken into consideration when reviewing applications:

- Demonstrated satisfactory academic progress
- Successful completion of college-level Math and English courses
- Total credit hours completed
- Academic standing at your previous institution

If you have fewer than 12 transferable credits, we will also review your high school academic records.

Please keep in mind that some academic programs within the Peck School of the Arts, School of Architecture and Urban Planning, College of Engineering & Applied Science, and College of Nursing may have additional requirements for direct admission into their majors.

We encourage students to utilize this guide to plan their coursework for their first and second semesters at Gateway. We highly recommend that students who are interested in transferring contact a UWM Transfer Advisor for more information about additional requirements of specific academic programs.

Admission to the School of Education Major Requirements

- Mandatory meeting with advisor in the semester following 40-credit semester;
- Minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 in required program courses (all courses listed on the program sheet);
- Completion of dispositions and field evaluation from [CURRINS 333](#) or [CURRINS 300](#); and
- Completion of [MATH 175](#) and [ENGLISH 102](#) (or score of 4 or higher on English placement test).
- Applications must be received by December 15 for Spring, July 15 for Fall

Minor Requirement			
Students must select and complete one minor. Each minor requires a minimum of 15-18 credits. Pre-professional coursework can be used to meet minor requirements. Minor options are Natural Science; Mathematics; English/Language Arts; Social Studies; English as a Second Language (ESL). Bilingual Education minor/license may be added in conjunctions with any one of the above-mentioned minor areas. Consult the UWM transfer admissions advisor for course options at Gateway.			

A maximum of 72 credits may transfer from Gateway to UWM.

*Discuss GER options with advisor to see which are transferable.

**Can be satisfied by satisfactory placement exam score or coursework. Foreign language may be met by 2 years of HS study.
