Admission Guidelines

Transfer admission is a holistic and selective process, and no single criterion guarantees admission. The following factors are taken into consideration when reviewing applications:

- Demonstrated satisfactory academic progress
- Successful completion of college-level math and English courses
- Total credit hours completed
- Academic standing at your previous institution

If you have fewer than 12 transferrable credits, we will also review your high school academic records.

Please keep in mind that some academic programs within the Peck School of the Arts, School of Architecture and Urban Planning, College of Engineering & Applied Science, and College of Nursing may have additional requirements for direct admission into their majors.

We encourage students to utilize this guide to plan their coursework for their first and second semesters at UWM at Waukesha or Washington Co. We highly recommend that students who are interested in transferring contact a UWM Transfer Advisor for more information about additional requirements of specific academic programs.

Admission to Public Health Major Requirements

Applications to the School of Public Health program will be considered at the end of each semester, as long as your cumulative UWM GPA is 2.5 or above and you have met the grade requirements for required courses.

The School of Public Health curriculum consists of 120 total credits. Of those 120 credits, there are 54 credits in the Public Health major, 39 credits of general and foundation courses, and 27 elective credits.

The following courses are suggested to prepare for admission to the School of Public Health:

- ENGLISH 102: College Writing and Research or completion of the UWM English competency requirement
- ENGLISH 201: Strategies – Academic Writing
- MATH 105: Intermediate Algebra or a Math placement level C on the proficiency test
- COMMUN 103: Public Speaking
- KIN 270: Statistics in Health Professions / MTHSTAT 215: Elementary Statistical Analysis
- BIO SCI 102: Elements of Biology
