Through the generosity of the Shorewood Woman's Club, UW-Milwaukee is pleased to announce a scholarship opportunity for undergraduate women planning to continue their studies during the 2017-2018 academic year. The primary purpose of this scholarship is to assist new and returning non-traditional students with completing their UWM degree. This is a one-time, non-renewable scholarship. Prior recipients of this scholarship are not eligible.

Number and Value: One or two scholarships will be available; minimum of \$1,000.

Eligibility Requirements:

1. Returning adult student (*must be age 25 or older*), with preference to female applicants.
2. Must have completed at least one semester at UWM (including any 2017 Spring semester courses in progress).
3. Cumulative UWM GPA of 3.00 or higher (after review of transcript and/or Spring 2017 grades).
4. Current (Spring 2017) undergraduate enrollment in 6 or more credits. Freshmen, sophomores, juniors and seniors may apply; preference may be given to first Bachelor's candidates.
5. Must be registered in an undergraduate degree program at least half-time for the upcoming (2017 fall) semester (will not graduate prior to December 2017).
6. Resident of Wisconsin (must have Wisconsin residency for tuition purposes).
7. Demonstrated financial need. Completion of the 2017-2018 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) by this application's deadline date is recommended. FAFSA results will be reviewed as a standard determination of financial need.
