Setup

Here are some tips to improve the quality your recording:

- **Camera angle:** The camera should point to the top of your eyes. Avoid the “up the nose” camera angle. Frame your shot close and tight versus wide and far. Look directly at the web cam as much as possible to address your viewers, not at your computer screen.
- **Audio quality:** Find a quiet room with minimal distracting background noise. In your audio settings make sure you have your desired device/mic selected (sometimes software defaults to a computer’s inferior built-in mic) and adjust the input level to avoid distortion caused by too much volume. Be as close to your mic as possible and try

to maintain the same distance throughout, talk toward it at all times, and try to be consistent with how loud you talk. For best results, use a headset mic or dynamic mic that is more focused (reduced background noise). REMEMBER TO UNMUTE YOUR MIC!

- Lighting: Do not record in a dark room, it will create a spooky Halloween effect. Do not record yourself in front of a window; this will create a silhouette effect.
- Background distractions: Avoid recording in a cluttered room; a busy office space and personal spaces (bedrooms, kitchens) are very distracting.
