ACADEMICS

- 13 degree-granting schools and colleges, along with the Graduate School and School of Continuing Education
 - Wisconsin's only accredited architecture school
 - Wisconsin's only accredited school of public health
 - The only North American school dedicated solely to freshwater sciences
 - Largest nursing program in Wisconsin
 - Film program ranked among the top 50 in the world by Variety magazine
- 205 academic programs
 - 3 associate programs
 - 98 bachelor's programs
 - 66 master's programs
 - 38 doctoral programs
- Largest and top-rated online education program in Wisconsin
 - More than 850 online courses prior to the COVID-19 pandemic
 - 40 fully online degree and certificate programs
 - Named best in Wisconsin by thebestschools.org

RESEARCH

- Ranked in the top 3 percent of research universities, a category known as R1, by the Carnegie Classification of Institutions of Higher Education
- \$40 million in grants in 2019-20
- 2018 Campus-Wide Award for Undergraduate Research Accomplishments from the national Council on Undergraduate Research
 - 1,000 undergraduate researchers

- Total enrollment: 24,725
 - Milwaukee campus: 23,004
 - » 18,493 undergraduates
 - » 4,511 graduate students
 - UWM at Washington County: 500 students
 - UWM at Waukesha: 1,221 students
 - Students from 71 Wisconsin counties and 47 states
- Milwaukee campus:
 - 1,007 international students from 83 countries
 - 1,018 veterans and military-related students enrolled, more than any other Wisconsin university
 - 35% of undergraduates are first-generation college students
 - 32% are students of color

CAMPUSES

- Milwaukee
 - 104-acre main campus and auxiliary locations
 - 53 buildings, including satellite locations, covering about 7.4 million square feet
 - Waukesha
 - 86-acre campus and auxiliary locations
 - 11 buildings covering about 280,000 square feet
 - Washington County
 - 87-acre campus in West Bend
 - 4 buildings covering nearly 200,000 square feet
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ALUMNI

- 195,000 alumni
 - 71% live and work in Wisconsin
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BUDGET & TUITION

- \$677 million operating budget
 - Includes \$146 million in aid passed directly to students
 - State appropriations make up about 22% percent of the remainder
 - Single largest source of income is student tuition (30%)
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ECONOMIC IMPACT

- \$1.5 billion economic impact on Wisconsin, according to NorthStar Consulting Group
 - 6,200 employees, including 3,100 student workers, as of Oct. 31, 2020
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DEVELOPMENT

- Our most recent development campaign, Made in Milwaukee, Changing the World: The Campaign for UWM, raised \$251 million from 2012 to 2019
 - More than 21,000 donors
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COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

- Partnerships with more than 3,700 businesses, nonprofits and other organizations
 - 59,000 hours volunteered by students in 2019
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ENTREPRENEURSHIP

- 24,000-square-foot Lubar Entrepreneurship Center and UWM Welcome Center opened in spring 2019
 - 146 I-Corps teams trained since 2015
 - More than 4,400 students participated in entrepreneurship workshops in 2020
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ATHLETICS

- 15 Division I teams feature 338 Panther athletes
- 142 conference championships
- 61 NCAA Tournament appearances
- 41 consecutive semesters at a 3.0 GPA or above
