What can we do for you?

The Center is home to a number of resources available to students and other members of the UWM community. Besides providing a physical space for students to relax and study, we also provide free safer sex materials, informative pamphlets, and a lending library of over 1000 books relating to LGBTQ+ authors, issues, and history. We can also connect students with important resources located elsewhere on campus, including gender neutral bathrooms, the UWM food pantry, and the resources at the Norris Health Center.
