Chancellors Graduate Student Award Application

The Chancellors Graduate Student Award (CGSA) is a fellowship to attract and retain graduate students with exceptional academic records and high promise of future success, especially in the area of athletic training research. It is available for students who meet the requirements and are admitted into the Masters of Science in Athletic Training (MSAT) program and who have a strong interest in engaging in research while at UW-Milwaukee. This one-time award totaling approximately \$4000 will be given to one qualifying MSAT student each year and awarded in the Summer term of the first year in the program.

Requirements for fellowship include:

- A student admitted into the MSAT program.
- Previous research experience or an interest in engaging in research in the areas of: (a) risk factors for lower extremity injury, (b) preventative and rehabilitative intervention of the lower extremity, or (c) injury prevention and performance training in the tactical athlete.
- Participate in the research process for an agreed upon project under the supervision of an MSAT Faculty.
- Devote your 3 elective credits required for the program to the research project by enrolling in KIN 798 or 799.
- Produce an abstract to be submitted for presentation at one of the following conferences. If the abstract is accepted for presentation, you will be required to attend the meeting and present.
 - NATA (abstract due November 15th)
 - GLATA (abstract due November 1st)
 - WATA (abstract due early March)

(Preference given to those committed to submitting to NATA or GLATA)

To apply for this award, submit the following as part of your ATCAS application to the MSAT program:

- Current resume
- Narrative responses to the following questions:
 - What is your previous experience in research?
 - Why are you interested in engaging in research at UWM?
 - What are your current research interests and how do they fit into the areas of: (a) risk factors for lower extremity injury, (b) preventative and rehabilitative intervention of the lower extremity, or (c) injury prevention and performance training in the tactical athlete
 - What are your career goals and how will this experience help you to achieve your goals?

Application Deadline

To be considered for the CGSA award, you must submit the above information with your ATCAS application to the program during the Early Decision cycle of program admission, due on **November 15th**.
