Mothers with children are more likely to be evicted than single adults (Desmond, 2012)



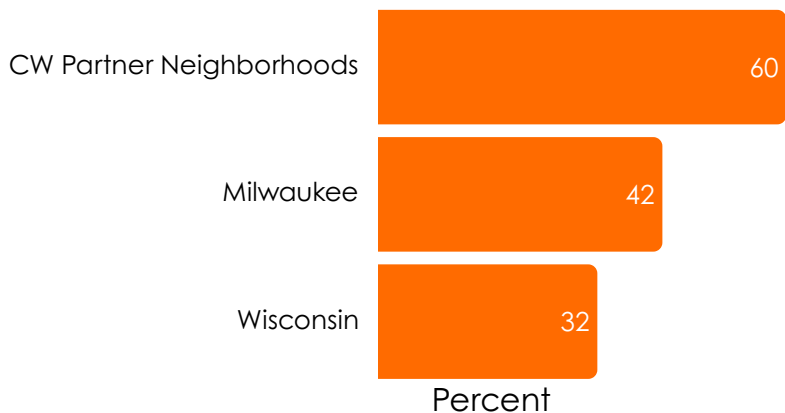
1 in 29 renters in Milwaukee has eviction (Desmond, 2012)

Families Paying More than 30% of Income For Housing



Residents in Children's Parnter Neighborhoods in Milwaukee pay more than 30% of their income towards housing at a 87% higher rate than Wisconsin overall.

Data Driven Decisions
