




Jobs Inaccessible by Transit






Racial and Economic Equity

Increasing diversity, but persistent poverty among people of color

➤ Milwaukee metro area disparities are far more pronounced than almost all other

metro areas

FlexRide is trying to tackle transportation barriers that limit job opportunities for many Milwaukee residents

FlexRide Milwaukee



What is FlexRide?

- ➤On-demand transportation pilot
- Funded initially by \$1 million grant from NSF
- Led by UWM/SEWRPC and supported by numerous partners
- Connects workers from Milwaukee to jobs in NW suburbs (for now)
- ➤ All City of Milwaukee adults eligible to join pilot if they work or want to work in the Employment Zone





FlexRide Milwaukee



The Basics

- ➤On-demand: once a rider requests a ride, a vehicle will usually pick up within minutes
- ➤ Microtransit: may share rides
- ➤ Service hours: weekdays 4:30a.m. 11:30p.m.
- Fares: to/from Zone 1 is free, to/from Zone 2 is \$1.50 per one-way trip
- > Research: participants asked to take surveys




Milwaukee Neighborhood Zones







How to Ride


Apply at flexridemke.com. If you're approved, you'll receive an email with an access code.

Download the FlexRide
Milwaukee app from the
App Store or Google Play
Store. Follow the sign up
steps, then enter your
access code in the "Promo
Codes" section of the app.

Enter your pickup and dropoff locations, then choose the ride that works best for you. Be sure to tap the Wheelchair icon if you need an accessible vehicle!


Check the app to find out exactly where to meet the vehicle, which may be a short walk from the location you gave us.

Service Model Evolution

- >Started in February with 5 pickup points and two employment zones
- Switched in April to two pickup zones and one combined employment zone



Accessible to All

- ➤ Wheelchair accessible
- ➤ Call-in option for those without a smartphone
- ➤ Cash payments for unbanked individuals




How Big is the Market?

FlexRide Milwaukee Completed Rides by Month March-September 2022




Is Microtransit Cost-Effective?

Challenges and Lessons Learned

- >It's a lot of work!
- > Lack of a regional entity to operate
- ➤ Tight labor market
- ➤ Vehicle/driver supply challenges
- ➤ Newness of service
- > Research component complications
- ➤ Global service provider pros and cons
- ➤ Perception as supporting low-density development patterns
- ➤ Difficult and costly to cover all shift times
- ➤ COVID concerns a barrier to sharing rides



Rider and Employer Feedback

- >Rider satisfaction appears high, but concerns raised
 - Average ride rating of 4.9
 - Riders needing education on shared-ride concept
 - Increasing demand and driver supply issues leading to longer wait/travel times, not being able to book a ride
 - Customer service quality complaints
- > Employer engagement varies widely
 - Some heavy users, some with only one or two employees
 - Impacts and concerns when riders experience issues
 - Willingness to pay varies and requires high-level approval

Next Steps

➤ Complete Pilot Research

- Applications closed, pilot ends Oct. 31
- Surveys and research ongoing
- NSF CIVIC Closing Event held Sept. 21-23
- FlexRide Symposium scheduled for Nov. 16

➤ FlexRide Expansion

- MobiliSE leading effort to sustain and expand
- Funding through at least end of 2024 provided by State plus additional potential funding sources
- Current service to continue thru March 31, 2023
- FlexRide 2.0 to launch April 1, 2023
- RFP for issued, deadline for proposals is Nov. 18



State announced \$4.2 million to support expansion of FlexRide Milwaukee
