Introduction

Many students start at College of Lake County and continue their education at UWM. This guide outlines recommended course selections for College of Lake County students who intend pursue a Bachelor of Arts (BA) at UWM with a Communication major.

Note: This guide does not replace the advice of an advisor who can provide personalized guidance based on your particular circumstances and background.

UWM Admissions Requirements

College of Lake County students seeking admission to a major that leads to a bachelor's degree in the College of Letters & Science will present the strongest application packet by meeting the following criteria:

- evidence of high school graduation (diploma or GED)
- a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 in all college classes
- completion of at least 12 credits of transferable college coursework

Students with a college cumulative GPA below a 2.0 who have not been enrolled in classes for at least 2 years, or who have extenuating circumstances, will also be considered for admission if additional information is presented that indicates potential for success.

Goal

While at College of Lake County, students can complete the following UWM requirements on a pathway towards a UWM BA in Communication:

- ✓ Arts Requirement (3 required credits can be completed at College of Lake County)
- ✓ English Requirement (Part A can be completed at College of Lake County, it is recommended that Part B be completed at UWM as part of the Communication major)
- ✓ Math Requirement (Part A and Part B can be completed at College of Lake County)
- ✓ Formal Reasoning (Will be completed at UWM as part of the Communication major)
- ✓ Natural Science Requirement (all 12 required credits with one lab can be completed at College of Lake County)
- ✓ Humanities Requirement (6 of the 12 required credits can be completed at College of Lake County, the remaining will be completed at UWM as part of the major)
- ✓ Social Science Requirement (6 of the 12 required credits can be completed at College of Lake County, the remaining will be completed at UWM as part of the major)
- ✓ Cultural Diversity Requirement (3 required credits can be completed at College of Lake County)
- ✓ International Requirement (9 required credits can be completed at College of Lake County with careful course selection)
- ✓ World Language Requirement:
 - o 4 years of a single language other than English in high school OR
 - o 4 semesters of a single language other than English in college OR
 - o 2 years of a language other than English high school + 3 semesters of a different language other than English in college OR
 - o 3 years of a language other than English high school + 2 semesters of a different language other than English in college
- ✓ Communication major requirements (12 of the 36 required credits can be completed at College of Lake County)
