## Introduction

Many students start at College of Lake County and continue their education at UWM. This guide outlines recommended course selections for College of Lake County students who intend pursue a pre-med or pre-healthcare path, most commonly with a biology, biochemistry or chemistry major.

Note: This guide does not replace the advice of an advisor who can provide personalized guidance based on your particular circumstances and background.

## UWM Admissions Requirements

College of Lake County students seeking admission to a major that leads to a bachelor's degree in the College of Letters \& Science will present the strongest application packet by meeting the following criteria:

- evidence of high school graduation (diploma or GED)
- a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 in all college classes
- completion of at least 12 credits of transferable college coursework

Students with a college cumulative GPA below a 2.0 who have not been enrolled in classes for at least 2 years, or who have extenuating circumstances, will also be considered for admission if additional information is presented that indicates potential for success.
