Other circumstances may also be considered. **Only complete appeals will be considered. Submitting an appeal does not automatically guarantee approval.** The Financial Aid Department will determine if an appeal is approved and if eligibility to participate in the Lawton Program can continue.

If the appeal is denied, the student is responsible for enrolling in and satisfactorily completing the one credit ECON 110 Economics of Personal Finance course.
