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**DPI ACT 31 Requirement:** By Law, all students seeking licensure through the state of Wisconsin are required to take a course regarding Native American history, literature or culture. These courses (to be taken at UWM) include: American Indian Studies 203, History 263, Anthropology 213 or the ACT 31 workshop.

**Basic Skills Requirement (PPSR)** Wisconsin law also requires prospective teachers to complete the PPSR which can be met through satisfactory ACT, SAT, GRE, or CORE exam scores. <sup>4</sup> Art Education students: COMM 101 recommended; COMM 103 is used towards limited general electives as well as other courses required to satisfy university required competencies, such as Math and English coursework

<sup>5</sup> Art Education students are also required to pass Praxis II and edTPA requirements while at UWM.

**\*Students must submit a portfolio of 8-10 works for scholarship consideration prior to enrollment at UWM.** (In addition to the initial portfolio submission all DVC, DSP, and Photo students must submit a portfolio upon the completion of specific coursework and FYP. Please visit the PSOA website for details: <http://www4.uwm.edu/psoa/artdesign/admission/>)

**\*\*Due to the specificity of courses, students not pursuing an articulation agreement program and are interested in the arts should only attend a MATC for a maximum of one year.** During that year, students are recommended to complete all available equivalent First Year Program courses. Early interaction with UWM’s course of study is the most effective way of completing degree requirements in a timely manner. It is strongly recommended that you contact an advisor at UWM in the PSOA as soon as possible to discuss transfer options.
