Admission Guidelines

Transfer admission is a holistic and selective process, and no single criterion guarantees admission. The following factors are taken into consideration when reviewing applications:

- Demonstrated satisfactory academic progress
- Successful completion of college-level math and English courses
- Total credit hours completed
- Academic standing at your previous institution

If you have fewer than 12 transferable credits, we will also review your high school academic records.

Please keep in mind that some academic programs within the Peck School of the Arts, School of Architecture and Urban Planning, College of Engineering & Applied Science, and College of Nursing may have additional requirements for direct admission into their majors.

We encourage students to utilize this guide to plan their coursework for their first and second semesters at UWM @ Waukesha & Washington Co. We highly recommend that students who are interested in transferring contact a UWM Transfer Advisor for more information about additional requirements of specific academic programs.

Admission to BS Information Science & Technology Requirements

Admitted students will receive a detailed program plan from a SOIS advisor specifying which degree requirements have been satisfied and which remain to be completed at UWM.

Students must complete a minimum of 120 credits (including transfer & UWM work), and satisfy all degree requirements:

- UWM General Education Requirements (GER) that have not been satisfied with courses accepted in transfer. GERs include competency requirements in oral & written communication, quantitative literacy, & foreign language, as well as distribution requirements in arts, humanities, social sciences, natural sciences, and cultural diversity (21 credits)
- IST Core Courses (27 credits)
- IST Upper Division Electives (15 credits)
- IST Cross-Functional Electives (15 credits)
- IST General Electives (42 credits)

Individual circumstances will vary based on the General Studies courses a student transfers in, but the goal is for students transferring under this agreement to need no more than 60 credits at UWM.
