Admission Guidelines

If you have completed 12 credits of transferable course work you will be considered for admission based on a review of your college records. If you have fewer than 12 transferable credits you may be considered for admission based on a review of both your high school and collegiate records.

Most admitted transfer students have a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or greater on all transferable coursework. Competency in English and mathematics is an important factor in the admission decision.

Please note that some selective programs (Peck School of the Arts, School of Architecture and Urban Planning, College of Engineering, College of Nursing) may have additional requirements for direct admission into their majors.

We encourage students to utilize this guide to plan their coursework for their first and second semesters at WCTC. We highly recommend that students who are interested in transferring contact a UWM Transfer Advisor for more information about additional requirements of specific academic programs.

School of Education Information

The Early Adolescence through Adolescence (EA-A) Program in Social Studies Education is available for students who plan to teach Social Studies to children from age 10 to age 21, in 6th through 12th grade. Candidates who satisfactorily complete the program requirements meet the Wisconsin teacher certification requirements for grades 6 through 12 (EAA).

Students must complete 36 credits in one Social Studies content area, 12 credits in a second and 12 credits in a third Social Studies content areas. Areas of study include economics, geography, history, psychology, political science, and sociology.
