Admission Guidelines

If you have completed 12 credits of transferable course work you will be considered for admission based on a review of your college records. If you have fewer than 12 transferable credits you may be considered for admission based on a review of both your high school and collegiate records.

Most admitted transfer students have a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or greater on all transferable coursework. Competency in English and mathematics is an important factor in the admission decision.

Please note that some selective programs (Peck School of the Arts, School of Architecture and Urban Planning, College of Engineering, College of Nursing) may have additional requirements for direct admission into their majors.

We encourage students to utilize this guide to plan their coursework for their first and second semesters at WCTC. We highly recommend that students who are interested in transferring contact a UWM Transfer Advisor for more information about additional requirements of specific academic programs.

School of Education Information

The World Languages Program is available for students who plan to teach a world language to children from birth to age 21, in PK through 12th grade. Students who satisfactorily complete the undergraduate program will be granted a license in one of the following languages: American Sign Language, Chinese, French, German, Hebrew, Italian, Latin, Russian and Spanish. Students may select the World Language major for grades PK through 12th grade. The World Language minor will result in the additional certification at the same level as your initial license.

World Language student gain real world experience through a required immersion experience and in the classroom by student teaching at area schools. Students at this level of certification may also add the following licenses while pursuing or after obtaining their World Language licensure as their initial certification:

- Bilingual
- English as a Second Language
