Admission Guidelines

If you have completed 12 credits of transferable course work you will be considered for admission based on a review of your college records. If you have fewer than 12 transferable credits you may be considered for admission based on a review of both your high school and collegiate records.

Most admitted transfer students have a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or greater on all transferable coursework. Competency in English and mathematics is an important factor in the admission decision.

Please note that some selective programs (Peck School of the Arts, School of Architecture and Urban Planning, College of Engineering, College of Nursing) may have additional requirements for direct admission into their majors.

We encourage students to utilize this guide to plan their coursework for their first and second semesters at UW-Colleges. We highly recommend that students who are interested in transferring contact a UWM Transfer Advisor for more information about additional requirements of specific academic programs.

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School of Education Information

The World Languages program is available for students who plan to teach a world language to children from birth to age 21, all grades in Wisconsin public schools. Students who satisfactorily complete the undergraduate program will be granted a license in one of the following languages:

- American Sign Language
- Chinese
- French
- German
- Hebrew
- Italian
- Latin
- Russian
- Spanish

This program requirements sheet shows Spanish content courses. General Education requirements are the same regardless of the language of licensure. Work with an advisor to determine if language content courses in your chosen concentration area are available at MATC.

World Language student gain real world experience through a required immersion experience and in the classroom by student teaching at area schools. Students at this level of certification may also add the Bilingual Education or English as a Second Language licenses while pursuing or after obtaining their World Language licensure.
