 - Keep a list of questions to follow-up on with your advisor

I want to declare a major.

- Meet with your Pathway advisor to review the declaration process for your major
 - Your advisor can confirm you meet the entry requirements for your major, connect you to your next advisor, and/or help you to meet the entry requirements for competitive majors
- After declaring, meet with your major advisor
 - Work with your major advisor to ask questions, learn about department opportunities to get involved in your field, and develop a graduation and career plan
- Visit the Career Planning & Resource Center
- Regularly review job opportunities related to your goals
 - While completing your major and degree, consider additional courses to help gain the skills and content listed in position summaries for jobs of interest to you
