#### ADDITIONAL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS FOR PSYCHOLOGY MINORS

**Credits:** Complete <u>at least 18 credits in Psychology</u>, including <u>9 credits at the 300-level or higher at UWM</u>.

Grade Point Average (GPA): You must have an average <u>GPA of at least 2.0 in all courses in the minor</u>.
<u>Transfer Students</u> – The Psychology GPA is calculated twice. Once based on grades in psychology classes taken here at UWM and again based on *all* of your psychology classes (from UWM and from other institutions).
