Admissions: Eligible applicants will hold a bachelor's degree with a minimum 3.00 GPA earned. No particular undergraduate major is required, although an academic background and/or work experience related to public administration is beneficial. Applicants must also submit either GRE test scores or GMAT test scores, and three letters of recommendation. English proficiency is also required; international students must submit TOEFL scores.

Financial Aid: Limited scholarship funding may be available for full-time students. Students loans are available to students taking six credits or more per semester.
