Program to Program Articulation Agreement

MATC Degree: Associate in Applied Science (A.A.S.) Animation

Peck School of the Arts/UWM: Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) in Animation

Effective Date: Spring 2018

Review Date: Fall 2023

Rationale:

Through the completion of the technical courses and general education courses taken while at MATC, students who earn the A.A.S. degree in Animation are prepared for advanced-level creative work at UWM. Students completing the B.A. in Animation at UWM will have the opportunity to apply their technical knowledge to advanced animation projects that require further creative, conceptual and technical development. UWM also offers students a wide range of elective courses through the PSOA and University that will complement their work as animators.

Requirements:

The UWM Animation B.A. is administered through the Department of Film, Video, Animation and New Genres in the Peck School of the Arts, in cooperation with the Animation Department in the School of Media and Creative Arts at Milwaukee Area Technical College.

Students must meet all minimum UWM transfer admission requirements. See <u>transfer.uwm.edu</u> for details.

MATC students who have successfully completed the A.A.S. in Animation degree (Program Code 10-207-1) will be granted junior status in the UWM B.A. in Animation degree program.

Students enrolled in the B.A. in Animation program must provide their own laptop computer, with animation software as specified for their courses.

To be admitted to the Animation B.A. program, students must have a cumulative 2.5 GPA from MATC and need to complete the Oral and Written Communication Part A (OWC-A) and Quantitative Literacy Part A (QL-A) requirements for UWM while at MATC. It is advisable that students also complete the General Education Requirements for Social Sciences, Natural Sciences and Cultural Diversity as part of their MATC A.A.S. Animation degree. Students should select from approved GER courses (SS, NS, NS+, CD/&). Students can complete the UWM Foreign Language Proficiency at MATC, or may satisfy this requirement by taking two semesters of the same foreign language at UWM. Additional information about UWM General Education Requirements can be found at ger.uwm.edu.

MATC students will enter the Department of Film, Video, Animation & New Genres with up to 60 credits, (39 credits in Animation and 21 credits of 200-level General Studies) and will take a minimum of 60 credits to complete the B.A. in Animation.

Program-to-Program transfer courses/credits are accepted only for the program/degree specified in this agreement. A change of major/degree/program invalidates these course/credits for transfer unless they are approved within other Program-to-Program Articulation Agreement for a different major/degree/program at UWM.
