Program to Program Articulation Agreement

MATC Degree: Associate in Applied Sciences (AAS) Television and Video Production

Peck School of the Arts (PSOA) at UWM: Bachelor of Fine Arts (BFA) in Theatre (Production)

Effective Date: Fall 2016

Review Date: Fall 2021

Rationale:

Through completion of the technical courses and general education courses taken while at MATC, students who earn the AAS degree in Television and Video Production are prepared for advanced-level theatre production work at UWM. Students completing the BFA in Theatre (Production) at UWM will utilize research, conceptualization and application of ideas and formal skills to support a personal professional, artistic and management competency for effective production work in the entertainment and theatre industry. UWM offers a wide range of electives throughout the University informing their production, design, and management experiences in the classroom.

Requirements:

Students must meet all minimum UWM transfer admission requirements. See transfer.uwm.edu for details.

MATC students who have successfully completed the AAS degree in Television and Video Production will be granted junior status in the UWM PSOA Theatre BFA in Production program.

Students enrolled in the BFA in Theatre (Production) program must have their own Apple MacBook Pro laptop.

To be admitted to the program students must have a cumulative 2.5 GPA from MATC and need to complete the Oral and Written Communication (Part A) and Quantitative Literacy (Part A) competency requirements for UWM while at MATC. It's advisable that students also complete the Social Sciences, Natural Sciences, and Cultural Diversity GER requirements as part of their MATC Television and Video Production Associate Degree. Students should select from approved GER courses (SS, NS, NS+, CD/&). Students can complete the UWM Foreign Language proficiency requirement prior to admission by taking 2 years of the same Foreign Language in High School, or 2 semesters of the same Foreign Language at MATC; or may satisfy this requirement by taking 2 semesters of the same Foreign Language at UWM. MATC students will enter the Theatre Department with up to 86 credits, and will take 34 credits minimum to complete the BFA in Theatre (Production).

Program-to-Program transfer courses/credits are accepted only for the program/degree specified in this agreement. A change of major/degree/program invalidates these courses/credits for transfer unless they are approved within other Program-to-Program Articulation Agreement for a different major/degree/program at UWM.

MATC/UWM Course Equivalencies:

Students earning the AAS degree in Television and Video Production from MATC will be able to transfer the credits listed in Table 1 toward the Bachelor of Fine Arts in Theatre (Production) in the Peck School of the Arts at University of Wisconsin – Milwaukee (UWM).

Additional courses will transfer per established equivalencies noted on the UW System Transfer Information System (https://www.wisconsin.edu/transfer/wizards/).
