The Academic Program and Curriculum Committee (APCC) is comprised of 21 members (20 voting members). Fifteen (15) faculty members proportionally representing each division; three (3) students selected by the Student Association; one (1) member representing the Academic Staff; one (1) member representing the Academic Deans Council (*ex-officio*), and one (1) member representing Enrollment Services.

Meetings were scheduled every three weeks during the 2002-03 academic year. Nine meetings were held during the year. One special meeting was called.

One hundred fifty (150) new courses were approved; three hundred thirty-eight (338) course changes were approved and forty-six (46) courses were deleted.
