A. Recommendation of the Subcommittee on Graduate Course and Curriculum for Changes to the Admission and Continuation Policies of the Graduate School (GFC Doc. No. 1328)

UWM Legal Affairs has indicated to the Graduate School that the academic dismissal policy needs to include three steps so that graduate students receive due process. The proposed revisions to the current GFC policy were discussed. Committee members shared current processes in their respective programs that are in place, but none specifically addressed academic dismissal. There was positive feedback to have the Graduate Scholastic Appeals Committee serve as the hearing body for the newly-created Step 2. The document will be revised to reflect this feedback and brought back to the GFC for a vote.

B. Impact of Intramurally-supported PAs in New Budget Model

This is a funding issue for non-tuition generating units that employ PAs. Discussion focused on PAs vs GAs, national norms, pay rates, and the negative impact on graduate enrollment and UWM's R1 status that this issue could have. There are approximately 100 current PA appointments. Some form of tuition sharing among units may be proposed. This issue will be discussed at a future UWM Deans meeting.
